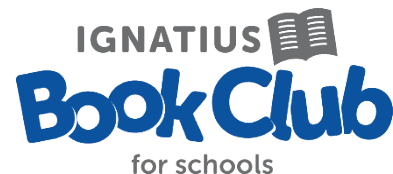

OUTDOOR RECESS: WINTER GUIDELINES

Winter is officially here, and a new year means a review of winter recess guidelines.

At PLA, we recognize the value of mid-day recess and time spent outdoors. Therefore, children will be sent outside to play during their recess period, if appropriately attired, unless the wind chill temperature is 0°F or below.

Appropriate winter attire includes snow pants, hats, mittens or gloves, and snow boots. Any student without appropriate winter attire will be kept indoors for the recess period.
