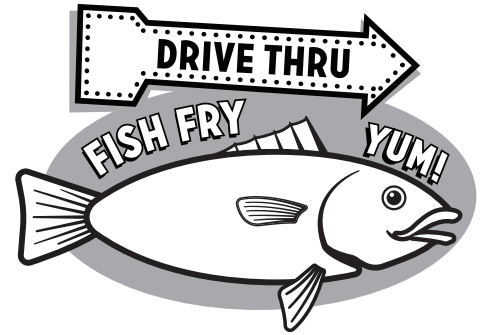


IGNATIUS Book Club for schools
