And what kind of school should you support? Look for and demand an education that enables, informs, and inspires these goals: Lutheran doctrine and practice in our churches. Lutheran worship and hymns in household, church, and school. Marriage and children as the pinnacle of Christian vocation. Vigorously Christian households rooted in God's Word. The wisdom and virtues of the classical education tradition grounded firmly in Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions. And look for faithful pastors and teachers with sound governance and discipline.

It is the great importance of the generational chain of Christians that moves us to this patronage. "For one real Christian is better and can do more good than all the men on earth: (Martin Luther, 1524, AE 45: 350). Passing the Christian faith and life to the next generation is of highest importance to us. It informs our priorities, our labors, our sacrifices, and our generosity. And we have the Apostle Paul's command to Pastor Timothy for those of us who have incomes, estates, or money in the bank (I Timothy 6: 17-19):

"As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good

works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life."
