The Fourth Sunday after Epiphany January 30, 2022

THEME: The Wind and the Sea Obey the Redeemer

Jesus arose from sleep and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. The miracle of the stilling of the storm is a picture of exactly what Jesus came to do in His suffering, death, and resurrection. The great tempest upon the Sea of Galilee, that threatened to destroy the disciples in their little boat, is a picture of the problem of sin, death and judgment that threatens to destroy us all. Jesus suffered what we deserve in order to rescue us from death, reconcile us to God, and give us the eternal peace of sins forgiven. So in the miracle of the stilling of the storm, we see the faithless and powerless disciples who are unable to save themselves from certain destruction. Jesus, who had entered into the boat and was asleep, arose from sleep and with a word brought about a great calm and rescued the disciples from death. Is this not a wonderful picture of how our Lord rose from the dead and with the Word of forgiveness calmed every accusation of the Law and bestowed upon us a great peace? "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?" He is the prophet greater than Jonah! He entered into the tempest of our sin and death and by His suffering and death He procured salvation for us all. Now, having risen from the dead, His Word gives peace and salvation to all who will receive it.
