THEME: JESUS PROMISES THE HOLY SPIRIT

On the Seventh Sunday of Easter, Jesus' catechesis directs us to the ministry of the Holy Spirit who was poured out upon the apostles on Pentecost. The Spirit is called the Helper or Comforter because His work is to minister the strength and comfort of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to us. The Holy Spirit will make it possible for the apostles and the Church to endure suffering and persecution without falling away from Christ. The Holy Spirit is also called the "Spirit of Truth" because He "testifies" through the Word of God to the truth of who we are, of who Christ is, and of what Jesus has done in love for our salvation. By the testimony of the Spirit alone, sinners are called to repentance and faith in Christ. Jesus also instructed His apostles that persecution is coming for the Church, so that when they experience the persecution they will not stumble and fall away from their faith in Christ. It is an amazing phenomenon that the message of ultimate love and comfort for sinners—the Gospel of Jesus Christ—should be met with such violent hatred. The hatred of impenitent unbelief can be so great that those who persecute Christians and put them to death actually live under the delusion that they are rendering God a service. In spite of such bitter hatred and persecution, Jesus teaches us that the Holy Spirit not only makes it possible for us to endure such suffering, but that through such persecution the Church and her ministers also testify to the suffering and death of Jesus as the source of salvation for the world.

Congregational Assembly: Budget and Elections Meeting is May 17.

On Monday, May 17, at 6:30 p.m., the Congregational Assembly will meet to review and approve the 2021-2022 fiscal budget and elect officers and board members for the upcoming year (terms of office begin September 1). Packets for the meeting are available in the narthex.

Capital Improvements Fund —What happens when the HVAC needs replacement, or we need a new roof? How do we pay for these expenses without a special fund drive? Since the retirement of the primary mortgage, the Parish Council, with the concurrence of the Congregational Assembly, has established the "Capital Improvements Fund" to help us meet those needs as they occur. Progress on Calling an Ordained Headmaster —Since the open forum in April, the Board of Education, Board of Elders, and Pastor Bender have been hard at work receiving recommendations of Headmaster candidates from LCMS officials and those involved in classical education throughout the Synod. A long list was narrowed down to five. Of those five, three have been brought to Peace for interviews and to observe the Academy and Parish life. It is important that the candidate who is finally called have doctrinal agreement with us, agree with the philosophy and theological foundation upon which Peace Lutheran Academy is established, possess the tools necessary to lead the Academy, and be able to work well with Pastor Bender as the Senior Pastor. A report will be given at the Congregational Assembly meeting on Monday evening, May 17. Both boards are meeting this week to discuss whether we are prepared to make a recommendation to the Congregation for a call, or whether we should continue the search for additional candidates.
