The Order of Service

The congregation arrives in silence.

Guests and the Lord's Supper: *Receiving the Lord's body and blood in the Lord's Supper celebrates the death of our Lord Jesus Christ as the only source of salvation for us as sinners. In Holy Communion, the Lord gives to us the forgiveness of sins that He earned for us upon the cross in the sacrifice and offering of His true body and blood on our behalf. The Lord's Supper is a gift of pure grace and may only be received by those who know their sin and who hunger and thirst for salvation in Christ. If you are a guest, please speak to the pastor before approaching the altar. We are concerned about the confession of faith and spiritual welfare of all who commune.*
