THEME: Come to the Feast, All Things Are Ready

The parable of the Great Supper teaches us that the call of the Gospel to receive salvation in Christ is like an invitation which is rejected because people have “more important things to do.” These “things” are really the false faiths of the flesh. They represent the idolatry of the sinful heart that believes in works or any other “god” for its life and salvation. If those who rejected would have believed in their true need for God's salvation, they would have received the invitation with joy. Those who are helpless and needy receive the invitation and believe the Gospel. Those who believe they have no need reject the invitation and are excluded from salvation.
