THEME: "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful"

"Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (vs. 36). "Jesus is not speaking here of the kind of mercy that human reason commends and suggests to us. This is a mercy which is selfish and self-seeking, which gives to those who are important and learned, to those who have earned it and merited it, to those whom it loves or who are beautiful, to those from whom it can expect some benefit or advantage. This is a particular, beggarly, tattered and tousled mercy. For if I give to him who has earned it, or if I consider beauty or friendship, I am only performing a duty or paying a debt and not carrying out an act of mercy at all... The mercy of Christians does not seek its own advantage or repayment of any kind. It ... [is] always extended in all directions. We ... open our eyes and keep them fixed on all men alike, on friend and foe, and [are] merciful, even as our heavenly Father is merciful." - Martin Luther

FORGIVE ONE ANOTHER

How does God, our heavenly Father, show His mercy? In that He gives us freely out of sheer goodness all that is good for body and soul, for time and eternity. If He should give us according to our merit, He could give us nothing but hell fire and eternal condemnation. Therefore, whatever good and honour He gives us, it is out of sheer mercy. He sees that we are struck in death, and He has mercy upon us and gives us life. He sees that we are children of hell, and He has mercy upon us and gives us heaven. He sees that we are poor, naked, hunger, and thirsty, and He has mercy upon us and clothes us, feeds us, gives us drink, and satisfies us with all that is good. Thus, all that we have in body and spirit He gives us, out of sheer mercy, and pours out all His goodness upon us. That is why Christ says here: “Be ye merciful, as your Father also is merciful’.

The mercy of Christians must not seek its own, but must be complete and comprehensive, regarding friend and foe alike, as our Father in heaven does.

And where this mercy is absent, faith also is absent.
