A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer For the Week of the Sixth Sunday after Trinity July 24 through July 31, 2022

Catechesis Notes for the Week — Faith in the Grace of God in Christ (This week's Bible Stories from the Gospel of Luke). Monday celebrates St. James, the Elder, who was the brother of John. James was the first of the Apostles to be martyred for his confession of faith in Christ. By the sufficiency of God's grace, he remained steadfast and faithful unto death. The narrative from Luke resumes on Tuesday. In the Parable of the Unjust Steward "the Lord Jesus is compared to an unethical man who alters the accounts of his master's creditors, so that their debt is reduced, and he is received by them into their home when the master casts him out. In the Lord's atonement for sin, He took the debt that we were responsible for paying and canceled it, so that we might receive Him for our eternal good. The axiom is true: it is beneficial to show mercy. This parable teaches that the unbeliever is often quicker than the believer to understand the potential benefits of showing mercy to others with one's material goods. Jesus commends this understanding." The Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus raises the questions: "Who is your god? What do you worship? Is God's judgment at death final? How does God warn me of the judgment of hell? What brings me to repentance and true faith? ... Each received what he believed in: the rich man received the comforts of this life and of his own achievements, which did not last, and the beggar received the comfort of God's salvation through the faith of Abraham, which endures to eternal life..." In Faith as a Mustard Seed, Jesus warns of the offense of works righteousness which destroys faith and extols the gift of saving faith in the Gospel of God's forgiveness. In the Ten Lepers Are Cleansed "Jesus shows that His grace and salvation is intended for all sinners, even those who would not return to Him in faith, and that fellowship with God is restored to us sinners only through the cleansing afforded us by Him who has fulfilled the Law's requirements on our behalf." (Excerpts from New Testament Catechesis in the Lutheran Catechesis Series).

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Give us fervent faith in Jesus and the blessed hope that He will come again to judge the living and the dead, giving the gift of eternal salvation to all who believe in Him; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Genesis 2:7-17: The prophet Moses teaches us that we were created by God from the dust of the earth. Our life comes from the Word of God. The Tree of Life gave life according to God's promise, but man chose to turn away from that tree and go his own way. This is the origin of all sin and death. Christ redeems us from the curse by being lifted up upon the tree of the cross.

Romans 6:19-23: St. Paul teaches that the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Mark 8:1-9:** Jesus is the bread of life. In the miracle of the feeding of the 4,000, He shows Himself to be the Savior of all people and the source of all life and salvation. The numbers in this story are not insignificant. Numbers in the Bible have familiar usages. The number seven is often God's number of perfection and is often associated with the Holy Spirit, His seven-fold gifts of grace, and the Church which is formed from every tribe and nation of people. The number four is often associated with the earth, sometimes spoken of as having "four corners"—north, south, east, and west—from which all the people of Christ's Church will come. The number ten is often the number of God's providential completeness in His dealings upon this earth. He does just the right things in just the right ways, etc. The number three refers to the Holy Trinity, Holy Baptism, and the Baptismal character of our faith, that we were buried with Him who was raised the third day. Therefore, by the use of the number three and the number seven multiplied ten times over, this miracle teaches that Jesus is Lord, the Holy One of God, the perfect and only savior of sinner who has provided salvation to the four corners of the earth.
