Catechesis Notes for the Week — "Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand" (Isaiah 53:10). "It was God the Father's gracious will for our salvation that His Son should be crushed for our iniquities and that His soul should be offered up in atonement for our sin. In Jesus' baptism and in His transfiguration the Father spoke of His delight in His Son who was obedient unto death and who willingly offered Himself in love for the sin of the world. 'This is My beloved Son in whom I am well pleased' (Matthew 3:17; 17:5). The Father made Jesus an offering for sin. Jesus' 'seed' are all those who have come to faith in Him through the preaching of the Gospel. Through the Word of the Gospel Jesus becomes the spiritual father of every believer in Christ, as the prophet Isaiah earlier named Him the 'Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace' (Isaiah 9:6)." Isaiah 25:6-9: The mountain of the Lord, where He provides a feast for all people, is His Church in the eternal glory of heaven. In the resurrection to eternal life, the faithful have the promise that He will swallow up death forever and end all sorrow and suffering. In that day our confession of faith in Christ will be vindicated, as the prophet declares: "It will be said in that day: 'Behold, this is our God; We have waited for Him and He will save us. This is the Lord; We have waited for Him; We will be glad and rejoice in His salvation."

1 Cor. 15:1-11: Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures and Christ rose from the dead according to the Scriptures. This is important because the comfort and certainty of our salvation rests firmly upon God's Word alone. Only God's Word, revealed in the Scriptures, can give us the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation that Jesus earned for us in His death and resurrection. The apostle Paul is careful to declare that these saving events—Jesus' death and bodily resurrection from the dead—actually happened, just as the Scriptures say, that we might actually be saved from real sin and real death.

John 20:1-18: The account of the resurrection of our Lord from the Evangelist St. John emphasizes the intimate details that surrounded that first Easter. The disciples loved their Lord because of the love that they had received from Him. Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early on Sunday morning to weep and complete the preparations of the body for a proper burial. When she found that the tomb was empty, she ran to tell Peter and John, believing that someone had stolen Jesus' body. Peter and John's hurried visit to the tomb found it just as Mary had said, but they did not find Jesus' body. Finally, as Mary stood in bewildered grief in the cemetery garden, Jesus Himself, risen from the dead, spoke to her and called her by name. Overwhelmed with joy and love for Him she held onto His body with all her might. He was alive! He was risen from the dead, body and soul! She held on to her Jesus! What Mary did was not wrong. She did what true faith always does: it clings to Jesus' Word; it holds on to Him! In our grief and sorrows, we are strengthened by Jesus' comforting Word of forgiveness and grace; and we partake of His true body and blood in the blessed and sure hope that we will rise with Him bodily on the last day.
