Easter Sunday March 31, 2024

THEME: Christ Is Risen! Death Is Defeated! Alleluia!

The scene of our Lord's resurrection begins in a garden in the early morning on the first day of the week. The evangelist intends to remind us of creation and the Garden of Eden. After God finished His work on the sixth day of creation, man quickly turned away from the Lord's Word and plunged himself and all of creation into sin and death. After Jesus finished His work on the sixth day of Holy Week, Jesus quickly rose from the dead and the new creation was born out of the forgiveness of sins that Jesus earned for us in His death. The women's question, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" indicates that they and we were powerless to rescue ourselves from sin and death. Only Jesus could roll away the stone of death because only Jesus could conquer sin and vanquish the age-old Serpent's power to condemn. The message of the resurrection Gospel is that Jesus is risen from the dead to give forgiveness, new life, and salvation to sinners. This message was to be proclaimed to all His disciples, and especially to broken and contrite sinners, like Peter, who had left the courtyard of the High Priest in misery and shame. "Go and tell His disciples-and Peter-that He is risen from the dead!"
