A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer  
For the Week of the First Sunday in Advent  
December 1, 2024, through December 8, 2024

**Catechesis Notes for the Week — John's Birth Is Announced to Zachariah**—Our Advent midweek meditations prepare us to celebrate the birth of the Son of God in human flesh. This week, the Angel Garbiel announces to the priest Zachariah that he and Elizabeth will be the parents of the forerunner of the Messiah. Though he had been praying for this gift of salvation while officiating at the daily sacrifice, Zachariah doubted the Angel's message. He is struck mute and for nine months he is given the opportunity to meditate upon the faithfulness of the Lord's Word. Despite his doubt, the Lord kept His promise, and John was conceived and born to prepare the way for Jesus' coming. Advent is the season of kept promises. Our faith rests upon this comforting foundation of the Lord's Word.

## The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

## Theme: Cast Away the Works of Darkness and Put on the Lord Jesus Christ!

### Invocation

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

### Apostles' Creed

Verse: John 10:27-28

“My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me.  
And I give them eternal life,  
and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand.”

Psalm 25 and/or the appointed daily psalms listed below.

**Prayer on the Psalm:** Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness and put upon ourselves the armor of light now in the time of this mortal life in which Your Son, Jesus Christ, came to visit us in great humility, that in the Last Day, when He shall come again in glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to life immortal; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. What is the Second Petition? <b>Thy kingdom come.</b>	Preschool +
What does this mean? The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.	First Grade +
How does God's kingdom come? God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.	Second Grade +
What is the Third Petition? <b>Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.</b>	Preschool +
What does this mean? The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.	First Grade +

**Collect for the First Sunday in Advent**

*Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come, that by Your protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by Your mighty deliverance; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.*

**Daily Themes for Prayer — “Let us pray...”**

- Sunday:** *For the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.*
- Monday:** *For faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for one's calling and daily work; for the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for schools, colleges, and seminaries; for good government and for peace.*

- Wednesday:** *For marriage and family, that husbands and wives, parents and children live in ordered harmony according to the Word of God; for parents who must raise children alone; for our communities and neighborhoods.*
- Thursday:** *For the Church and her pastors; for teachers, deacons, deaconesses, and other church workers; for missionaries and for all who serve the Church; for fruitful and salutary use of the blessed sacrament of Christ's body and blood.*
- Friday:** *For the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.*
- Saturday:** *For faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.*

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**Looking forward to the Second Sunday in Advent**

**December 8, 2024**

**Malachi 4:1-6:** *The prophet Malachi prophesies concerning the coming of the “Sun of Righteousness” who will bring healing to all who trust in His Word. By His righteousness He delivers His people from the judgment of hell.*

**Romans 15:4-13:** *The Old Testament Scriptures were written to give us hope through the promises of the Holy Gospel. This hope and encouragement sustain and comfort us in the trials and hardships of life. It is a sure and certain hope.*

**Luke 21:25-36:** *The signs in the heavens, the distress of nations, and the perplexities upon earth are nothing for the Christian to fear. Although the whole world might be falling apart around us, the Christian takes courage from the Lord's Word because He knows that these are merely the signs leading up to the Lord's coming. The Lord is in complete and total charge and He will not forsake His flock, no matter how difficult the end times might get. The Lord will have “the last laugh” on the last day, for everyone “will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.” Our response to the signs of tribulation of the end times is to “look up,” that is, to anticipate and look forward to the Lord's return all the more. In other words, when we see the signs which cause the world great distress, we are called to be encouraged that the Lord is fulfilling His Word just as He said. “This generation”—the church— “will by no means pass away till all things are fulfilled. Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.” That is wonderful comfort for the redeemed of the Lord!*
