THEME: For By Grace You Have Been Saved

All the workers received the same wage regardless of when they were hired. What does this mean? All Christians receive the same gift of salvation regardless of when they come to faith. Why? Because salvation is based upon Christ's work and not our own. According to human reason, salvation is unfair because it is not based on our works at all, but is given freely by grace for Christ's sake. This is a parable of grace that teaches us that God shows no partiality in the bestowal of salvation. His gift is given solely on the basis of His undeserved love, and not because of a man's works.

Family Prayer Devotional Studies will be recorded by Pastor Bender and posted online weekly in preparation for each Family Prayer lesson. The lesson this week is *Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard — Matthew* 20:1-16. The parable presents a conflict to our human reason. Every worker receives the same wage regardless of when they started on the job. But this parable teaches us how we are saved by grace and not by our works. The only Worker whose work counts is the work of our Savior for our salvation. Look for the Family Prayer lesson and podcast on the congregation website under the Family Prayer tab.

Adult Catechesis (Didache) with Compline: We are on Lesson 17 – Naaman is Washed in the Jordan River which is the second lesson on Holy Baptism. How can water forgive sins, bestow the gift of the Holy Spirit, and make us children of God? "Certainly not just water, but the Word of God in and with the water does these things. The power of the Word of God in baptism is beautifully illustrated in the cleansing of Naaman the leper.

Divine Service Setting Five Lutheran Service Book p. 213

Setting 5 is Luther's setting of the Divine Service that utilizes hymns for the ordinary canticles of the Service (Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei, and Nunc Dimittis). This order of service will be used for the three Sundays of pre-Lent (Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima).
