The Baptism of Our Lord

January 11, 2026

THEME: Jesus Is Baptized to Fulfill All Righteousness for Us


Jesus' baptism signifies that the Son of God has not only become a flesh and blood man like us, but especially that He has come to align Himself with us as sinners and to take our sin upon Himself as the Lamb of God. We come to Baptism because Christ is the content of our Baptism. We come to have our sins washed away and forgiven for Jesus' sake. Jesus comes to the waters of Baptism, not because He has sin to be forgiven, but to give Himself into the waters of Holy Baptism so that Baptism has the power to forgive sins for us. He is the righteous Savior who has died for us. He fulfills all righteousness in our place. In His Baptism He gives Himself to us so that in our Baptism we might receive Him for the forgiveness of all sins. When we are Baptized God the Father declares us His beloved for Jesus' sake, the Holy Spirit descends upon us with the gift of faith, and Jesus and His righteousness becomes our own.
