THEME: Jesus Calls Fishers of Men

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the light that shines into the darkness of this world's unbelief and sin. The light of Christ shines wherever the Gospel is preached. Jesus preached in areas where both Jew and Gentile lived to show that He is the light of salvation for all people. His preaching always began in the synagogues in the towns and villages He visited to show that the Gospel is both preached in the Old Testament Scriptures and clearly fulfilled in His person and work. Simon Peter, Andrew, James, and John had met Jesus before they were called to be "fishers of men." They had been baptized by John at the Jordan River in the province of Judea. After their baptism, they returned to their life's work as fishermen. But now Jesus comes to them and calls them into a new vocation. Now they will leave their fishing business and become apostolic ministers of the Gospel. "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." Now they will begin to be trained by Jesus, so that after His Ascension into heaven they might continue His work by preaching the Gospel for the salvation of the world. Every baptized Christian is called to bear witness to their faith in Christ in whatever vocation God has called them. But there is an office of the Holy Ministry through which Christ's voice is to continue to be heard in the world in the public preaching of the Church.
