The First Sunday in Lent

February 22, 2026

THEME: The Valiant One Defeats Satan for Us!

Man fell into sin when he turned away from that Word that gave Him life. The season of Lent is a time to return to our Baptism in which our “Old Adam” is drowned in repentance and the “New Man” is made alive through the Word of our Savior. Jesus used God’s Word to defeat Satan’s attacks. God’s Word is our defense too. We especially need to rely on God’s promises of forgiveness through Christ. Jesus’ ministry began with His temptation in the wilderness, not simply to give us an example of how we can overcome temptations, nor to show Jesus as our coach, who says, “See, I did it, so can you!” Rather, it is to show Jesus as the faithful Man for us, our Savior, who says, “See, I did it for you!” He is the second Adam who is the man of resolute faith in the Father’s Word that the first Adam failed to be. Therefore, He is also our faithful high priest from whom we can receive grace to help us in every time of need when we are attacked by the Evil One.
